

John Harris, vice-president, assists the president in the execution of his duties, and he informally assumes many important responsibilities including keeping the Cabinet running smoothly.



Santa Monica High School's Viking Band, composed of 140 members, once again upheld its winning tradition by gaining recognition in every band review entered.




#### FALL DELIANS
