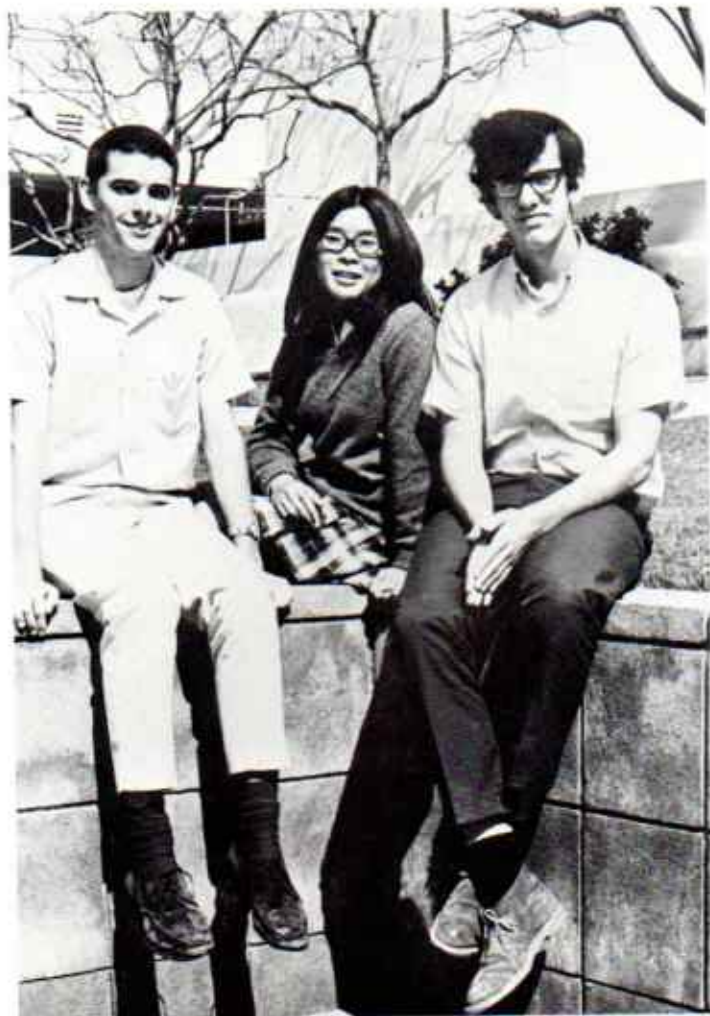
FALL DELIANS
